HEALTH GUIDELINES

All business owners are responsible for creating a safe and healthy product and stand that follow local health department guidelines. (Check your city's website to see if there are any specific local guidelines you should follow.)

- Always wash your hands with hot soapy water before preparing food. Wash your hands often.
- If your hair is long, tie it back or wear a cap.
- Prepare your foods on clean surfaces. Make sure counters, cutting boards, spoons and cutting knives are washed and sanitized before using them.
- Consider wearing a mask and gloves when preparing and serving your lemonade.
- Use paper or plastic pitchers to serve instead of glass.
- Hold cups at the bottom and do not touch the tops of the cups (where people's lips go).
- Cover the lemonade and ice cubes between serving to keep bugs and dirt out.
- Use a ladle or tongs to serve ice. Only use store bought, bagged ice.
- Be sure to have hand sanitizer and antibacterial wipes on hand and use them after every customer.
